

BAROQUE WANDERERS, 2018 Edition

From August 6 to 20, 2018, join Alison Melville and Colin Savage on a visit to the *Musica Antiqua Festival* in **Bruges, Belgium** (6 nights) and the *Naestved Early Music Festival* in **Naestved, Denmark** (5 nights), with three between-festival days in **Copenhagen.** The itinerary includes a minimum of thirteen concerts, several city and museum tours, historic site visits, morning 'pre-concert' chats, and more. Each day's schedule also allows time for personal wandering and exploring.

BRUGES:

Our first stop is at the world-renowned **Musica Antiqua Festival** in historic Bruges, a UNESCO heritage city also known as 'the Venice of the north.' With the 2018 theme of **Femmes Fatales/Wonder Women**, the festival's concert schedule features **Christine de Pisan's La Cité des Dames**, **Händel's Ode to Saint Cecilia**, and programs devoted to **Mary Stuart**, women of Greco-Roman mythology, and much more, performed by an array of international artists.

In addition, there's a **Fringe Festival** for which all concerts are free to attend; an early music fair; and the **International Competition Musica Antiqua**, which this year focuses on the harpsichord. Hear up-and-coming players from around the world, and cheer on any Canadian participants who may be there! The earlier rounds are free to attend, and we'll have a ticket to hear the Final Five.

Other non-musical events for us will include a walking tour of the old city, a visit to the gardens of the Beguinage, and a tour of the chocolate-making facilities at Bruges's Choco-World!

COPENHAGEN:

We head from Bruges to **Copenhagen** and spend three days exploring Denmark's capital and surroundings, including a canal tour with entry to the Tivoli Gardens, and additional options to visit Rosenborg Castle, Freetown Christiania, art galleries in the Vesterbro district of the city, and other places of interest.

NAESTVED:

From Copenhagen we'll head 1.5 hours south to the charming medieval town of **Naestved** for their early music festival, *'From Monteverdi to Vivaldi.'* The festival includes 7 concerts including the **premiere of a Vivaldi opera**, an afternoon of Italian madrigals, *'The Other Vespers,' 'The Musical Mafiosi'* and *'Musical Globus,'* organ recitals and more, performed by the Norwegian Baroque Soloists, I Fagiolini, Solamente Naturali, the Naestved Festival Orchestra, harpichordist Lars Ulrik Mortensen and others. Other festival activities include a guided walking tour of the town, and an 'Alehouse' evening with music by the Norwegian Baroque Soloists; and in our 'off' time we can visit Gavnø Castle and its gardens, explore the town and nearby harbour, and enjoy Danish 'hygge' and hospitality.

You will receive a full festival schedule in Bruges and are welcome to attend whatever additional events you choose. The Fringe concerts are usually free.
- 2) Your Passe-Partout ticket for the **Naestved Early Music Festival** also includes attendance to various smaller events such as organ recitals and breakfast concerts which will be listed on the Festival schedule.
- 3) Schedule subject to change. Concert tickets are confirmed but the festivals reserve the right to change programming/artists if necessary.
- 4) Additional informal trips to museums, art galleries and other places of interest are often arranged as the trip proceeds, by the group or by smaller groupings.

Biography



Toronto-born *Alison Melville* began her musical life by playing the recorder in a school classroom in London (UK). Her subsequent career on historical flutes of many kinds has taken her across North America and to New Zealand, Iceland, Japan and Europe, most recently to Switzerland and Finland. She is a member of Ensemble Polaris and Artistic Director of the Bird Project, appears regularly with Tafelmusik, and collaborates in many other varied artistic endeavors. Some personal career highlights include playing for The Tudors, CBC-TV's The Friendly Giant, and Atom Egoyan's The Sweet Hereafter; solo shows in inner-city London (UK) schools; an improvised duet with an acrobat in northern Finland this summer; and, oh yes, a summer of concerts in Ontario prisons. Alison has been heard on CBC/R-C, BBC, RNZ, NPR, Iceland's RUV, and on over 60 CDs. She taught for many years at the Oberlin Conservatory of Music, is currently on faculty at the University of Toronto and Wilfrid Laurier University, and teaches music appreciation classes for the Royal Conservatory of Music and Ryerson University's Life Institute. COLIN SAVAGE has been principal clarinetist with the Mississauga Symphony for more than 30 years, and regularly performs on recorder and historical clarinets with a wide variety of chamber and orchestral ensembles in Southern Ontario. He has toured Japan and performed several times in the Royal Opera House at Versailles with Opera Atelier, and worked with New York Collegium, Tafelmusik, Canadian Opera Company, Apollo's Fire, les Boréades and the Toronto Consort.

Colin particularly enjoys playing bass clarinet with the Arctic fusion band Ensemble Polaris, whose recordings of Nordic/Canadian/Mediterranean genre-bending music have received international critical acclaim and delighted audiences across Canada.

Colin's interest in analog photographic processes finds him in well-lit and very dark places; his images of abandoned spaces, shot with a vintage twin lens reflex camera, will be featured in a solo exhibition at Toronto's Alliance Française in April 2018.
